Dear Mr. Simpson, Dear Chairman of the Committee of transport and tourism,

Your interview the DVZ of July 21 has raised some concerns amongst ERFA.

- The background of the rail market that you describe look to some extend fatalist regarding the liberalization process. EU must drive the changes that the Member States face difficulties to implement. How will Europe improve if MEP's accept non performing systems to continue?
- We respect that very powerful historic operators lobby MEP's as we do. We cannot accept that they
  became even more powerful that their own home state and put MEP's under such pressure that they
  cannot follow their convictions.
- ERFA was surprised by your statement saying that no results have been achieved regarding long
  distance rail freight transport. Liberalization has boosted volumes, in UK, Germany, Sweden and
  even in France where the liberalization rates now 20 % in 5 year, the level achieved in 20 years in
  Germany, it contributes to stabilise a market in a critical shape.
- What ERFA wants is just the all operators being able to access the market without any hints. We came to the conclusion that separation is the simplest and cheapest tool to achieve it.

We believe that the 4<sup>th</sup> railway package is a unique tool to make the system progressing. We enclose to this letter our view on the matter.

We are at a strategic time in the process of liberalizing the rail market, it why we would be pleased to meet you in order to share our views on the European future of rail freight and to be allowed to speak at your event of October 16.
